Warm Up

- 1) If you had a chance to do a full redo of one day in your life, what day would that be and why?

Explore

- 2) Read Luke 22:31-34. What's Jesus saying to Peter? Why does Peter respond the way he does?
- 3) Read Luke 22:54-62. Where were the other disciples? (see Matthew 26:55-56).
- 4) What caused Peter's betrayal?
- 5) Describe Peter's response to Jesus' look.

Apply

- 6) What typically causes you to walk away from Jesus and His calling on your life? Where are you most vulnerable today?
- 7) The good news is that this is not the end of the story. While our sin and betrayals should break our hearts, the Lord does not give up on us. Jesus still went to the cross and died for Peter.
We have all been in Peter's situation, allowing our sin to break our relationship with the Lord. Yet Jesus is a Lord of grace. If there is anything keeping you from fully following Jesus, ask your group to pray with you and for you.
